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The HNC "Selecting a Preschool" survey is intended to help you as you research and evaluate the variety of preschool options available in Hingham and surrounding communities to find the best fit for you and your child. In the survey, we have summarized pertinent information about programs in Hingham and nearby. Don't panic! There are generally enough spaces to go around. Many families apply to multiple schools. All schools maintain waiting lists. It may take some time to shake out, but ultimately most families are offered a space in a desired program by June, or even as late as August.

This survey is not intended to be an exhaustive list of the preschools in the area. While it is fairly comrephensive in listing the Hingham preschools, many preschools in surrounding towns chose not to be included, and there are many other quality programs that have served Hingham residents in the past. Ask around; you may find the best match for you and your child through word-of-mouth.

We hope that the survey will answer many of your questions. We encourage you to visit the schools. Most schools schedule open house sessions which offer an opportunity to meet the director, teachers and parents, listen to presentations on the school philosophy and programs, ask questions and see the space. Many schools also welcome visits with your child so that the child may see and respond to the space. It is helpful to see the classrooms in daylight and under conditions of routine activity. The visits must be scheduled to avoid disrupting ongoing classes.

All the schools are dedicated to supporting a positive first school experience for our children. Remember, the most important consideration in this process is to find a program that is a good fit for your child and your family. Everyone's needs vary. For example, although you may like the idea of a cooperative school, if both parents have inflexible work hours, it may be hard to fulfill the parent helping commitments. In addition to the facts and figures that differentiate the schools, there are many intangibles. It helps to visit the schools and to talk with parents of current students. The schools will be able to furnish parental references upon request.

School Format/Philosophy

Montessori: The Montessori program is based on an education philosophy developed by Maria Montessori. Montessori programs are typically five day per week, multi-age formats.

Traditional: Traditional preschool programs are semi-structured, offering children encouragement and choices based on their interestes and abilities.

Cooperative: Cooperative preschools are similar to traditional learning formats with an emphasis on positive social interaction and flexible, experienced-based learning. In addition, parents are required to be actively involved in all aspects of the cooperative schools, from helping in the classroom monthly to serving on the board.

Integrated: Hingham Public School Integrated Preschool is an integrated program for typically developing children and those with special needs.

Daycare: Many of the traditional daycare centers in the area also offer preschools. Several of the preschools within the survey do have daycare options for infants through preschool. Further, these schools have extended day options offering parents flexibility with their schedules.

Playschool: Playschool pgrams provide a first "school" experience to children for 1 or more days per week.

Age Eligibility

A child must be five years old before September 1 of a given school year to be eligible for Kindergarten in the Hingham Public School system. Many preschool programs are structured as two year programs to prepare children for Kindergarten, and therefore require that applicants be three years old before September 1.

Within the survey, the schools have identified whether they accept students younger than Age 3 and whether they have a toddler program.

Application Process

All schools give priority in the registration process to returning students and siblings of present and past students. After determining how many openings are available, registration is open to new students. Most Hingham schools prioritize Hingham residents. Some enroll on a first-come, first served basis and others through a lottery or drawing in which all applications are treated as though they are received on the same day and then drawn by chance to fill open places. The same process builds waiting lists.

Number of Days per Week

There is a strong probability that at schools with both 2-day and 3-day options, most openings available to families not already in the system for three year olds will be in a two-morning program. If you think your child is ready for more time in school, ask to see if there is an option to create a third day thorugh Extended Day programs at some of the schools.

Common Concerns

Toilet Training: The law in Massachusetts requires preschools to accept children regardless of whether they are toilet trained. If you are close, but having minor difficulty, most schools will be willing to work with you to accomplish your goal. Call them early for suggestions. Ask your friends and family for advice. Mony of us have struggled; you are not alone. On the flip side, if your child is not toilet trained by the time you are shopping for preschools, it pays to ask questions when you visit the schools. There are no safe assumptions about toilet training, even if your child will be one of the oldest in his/her class. Some schools will hold the student's slot open but not allow the student to attend class in diapers or pull-ups; others will allow the student to attend, but may call the parents to change a diaper if necessary.

Allergies: All schools are required to have health policies and procedures per the Office for Child Care Services and other licensing/accreditation authorities. Many have first-hand experience in dealing with allergies, including potentially life-threatening reactions to peanuts, bee stings and other allergens. Note that if your child has not yet tried certain foods or been stung by a bee, you may not know if you will be affected. Even if your child has no allergies, a school's policy may require you to make modifications in what your child eats at school or brings for a snack. Ask when you call or visit the schools, and make sure you are completely comfortable iwht the school's policy and how it could affect you and your child.

Twins-or-More! Most, if not all, schools have priority placement for twins or more. If one sibling is admitted, all others will be place.

Affiliations: Although some schools are physically located in local churches, most operate independently.

Questions You May Want to Ask at Open Houses/Visits

- What sets your school apart from other preschools? What makes your program unique?
- · What is the teacher turnover, and what are the staff qualifications?
- How is the staff/parent interaction facilitated? How do you learn about a child's day or progress? Is there a memo board? What are the opportunities for parent involvement?
- What is the school's philosophy and level of structure, and what is the approach to discipline?
- How much emphasis is put on academics in the curriculum, and how much on social development?
- · What is the school population? How many children per class and what is the gender balance?
- · What is the cost?
- How are sensitive issues (eg. Faith, death, bias, etc) handled at school?
- Are snacks or food shared? If a child in the class has a known food allergy, are those foods allowed in the classroom?
- Can you observe a class in session (both prior to registration and/or once the child is enrolled and in session?)
- Is there a class list available in advance? It is nice to know in advance who will be in your class in order to arrange summer playdates to ease the transition into that important first school experience.

How do you encourage/discourage certain behaviors in the classroom?	Bright Horizons philosophy consistently emphasizes basic respect for the individual child. Young children are striving for understanding, independence, and self-control. Children learn by exploring, experimenting and testing the limits of their environment and experiencing the consequences of their behavior. In this way, they begin to understand how the world works, their own limits, and appropriate assertiveness. Children learn self-control and how the world works in a relaxed, positive atmosphere of support and understanding that recognizes the child's struggle. How do you encourage/discourage certain behaviors in the classroom?	We adhere to the principles and strategies of the Responsive Classroom to form the scaffolding of our social curriculum. Teachers model appropriate language, facilitate negotiation and support the resolution of differences directly and constructively, and the teachers play an essential role by helping each child look beyond him or herself, see another point of view and put words or actions into a bigger context. These learned skills develop independent thinking and a child's growing appreciation for the nuances in social connections with peers and adults alike. Our children play and learn at the same time! Though our building is an "antique" our classrooms are bright, colorful, and inviting and are set up just right to serve our wee students perfectly! Our playground, which was recently updated, is large and safe with a variety of wonderful equipment for the children. The children love the playground!

If yes, please provide a brief summary of your program.	we do not ofter a summer program per se but for the last two weeks of the school year Wilder School becomes "Camp Wilder" with camp tees, water play outdoors, popsicles, bubble fun, Arts and Crafts, a camp song all our own, and all the fun and activities of a summer "camp." "Camp Wilder" is a theme and the children and the staff have a great time with it! Camp is offered only to enrolled Wilder students.

Class Size	Our smaller classes have eleven children. Our one large class has eighteen. All have two teachers.
# of Teachers	We have four Lead teachers, and five teachers all certified by the State and all with college degrees. They are an incredibly creative and intuitive group of women who love children and delight in helping them learn and grow. We also have Assistant teachers.
Minimum Age by Sept 1	The minimum age is three by August 31.
What is your toilet training policy?	We encourage parents to toilet train their children prior to enrollment. However, we do not reject a child if this skill has not been acquired. We ask our parents to be phone accessible in the event of a toileting "accident."
What is your food allergy policy?	We are totally peanut-free. We constantly remind our parents of this rule. We are trained every year in administering an Epi-Pen and are alert to all our "allergy" kids and their needs. We aim to protect all our students.
Are you licensed and/or accredited? Please provide details.	We are licensed by the State Department of Early Education and Care and are monitored by them on a routine basis.
Please describe the application process for your school.	Parents should go to the Wilder website in order to enroll. They would download the application and send it to the school at 666 Main Street along with a \$50.00 enrollment fee. This fee is refunded if a child is not accepted into the program. A lottery in early March determines acceptance into Wilder.
What are the dates that applications are due for your program?	Applications are due on February 28, 2017 for the September 2017 program.
What is the application fee?	\$50.00 registration fee which is refundable if a child does not get in to the program.
How do you encourage/discourage certain behaviors in the classroom?	The Wilder staff provides a caring and supportive environment. At the beginning of each school year the classes set up their own set of rules and are reminded of these throughout the year. Being a GOOD FRIEND is always the first rule! Children are encouraged to "use your words, not your hands" with their school friends and they are given time to think about the consequences of their actions. In place of physical or negative behavior our students are taught proper ways to communicate with their peers. We set reasonable limits for children and help them to reach for their self-control. Recognizing and praising POSITIVE behaviors and actions may influence a child to behave in a more acceptable manner. Respect and an acceptance of others is all part of our curriculum. As children grow and mature they learn to express their needs and feelings in more appropriate ways.

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Do specialists visit the classroom? Do students go on field trips?	We invite a Policeman, Fireman, Dental Hygienist, Bike rider, Physician, and a Nurse to come to the classes to discuss safety issues of all types with the children. We also have musicians; animal trainers, Wildlife experts, Disney characters, special readers, puppeteers, and musicians for the children to enjoy. The children go to Weir River Farm, the Library, the Hingham Playground and the Recreation Center. The younger children celebrate all our summer birthdays at a variety of special, fun places with parents joining them.
Please give a sample schedule for a typical day in your program.	Every day the children experience the following: circle time/ sharing time where the "meteorologist" of-the-day will help his/her classmates with discussing that day's weather and the calendar. The day's activities are discussed at circle time as is Show and Tell (one child per day.) Free choice allows the children to choose their own activities in our different classroom centers. Every day there is a story followed by a washing of the hands and a simple snack; this is usually a very social time! If someone is celebrating a birthday then the parent attends and brings the special (peanut free) snack and of course we sing Happy Birthday! A project and other fun activities such as art, play-dough or a cooking project are offered. Our students learn the alphabet by using the "Lively Letters" program; it is the same program used by the Hingham public schools. The Wilder children are so ready for their Kindergarten year! The Wilder schedule remains the same every day, as children do not like surprises, but within the schedule the activities are changed. The children spend time in the playground every day unless it is raining or extremely cold. There is a great deal of learning happening at Wilder School. It is is a great place for children to learn, grow, and feel safe.
